Royal Arch Education By Comp. Kevin Bacon, HP of Oakland Chapter No. 5



The first experience a new Companion has upon petitioning a Chapter is the Mark Master degree. It is very much a continuation of the Fellowcraft degree, expands our working tools to reinforce discipline & education while correcting our irregularities, teaches us honesty, and reminds us of our obligation to another Brother Mark Mason in need.

It is the first time in our masonic journey that we reference the New Testament, but when we read Mathew 20 our thoughts align with the context of our recent experience – to that of being paid for our work in the quarries. We are cautious not to have firolous levity at this point of the ceremony but we do highlight our frustration that the newest Companion gets the same pay for barely working just one hour. It is human grumble a bit, especially if you are one of those that were hired early in the morning. The message however, isn't about jealously or that rich vineyard owners can do whatever they want with their money. So what is the point of the parable? Aren't we all Masons that "meet on the level?"

I was taught by Pastor Brian Weaver (Peace Church of Hurst, TX), that reading preceding verses often gives you additional context. Matthew 19:24-26 "Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said, "with man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Then as I re-read the parable of Laborers in the Vineyard it takes on a completely different meaning. Paraphrasing the notes in the Lutheran Study Bible, we cannot earn our way into that house not made with hands. No matter how hard we work to perfect our rough ashler, even with refinement by the engraver's chisel and mallet, we will never truly achieve perfection but this does not mean we shouldn't continue our efforts. Our admission to that celestrial building is through the grace of the GAOTU and we should be thankful that we have the opportunity for "the last to be first, and the first last."
