Royal Arch Education - St. John the Evangelist By Comp. Kevin Brown, PHP of Oakland Chapter No. 5

During December, while most of us will be focused on the Holidays and supporting our Brothers during their Blue Lodge Installations, lets not forget to honor one of our patron saints of Masonry - St. John the Evangelist.

We don't know the exact time period when Freemasonry adopted our patron saints but we begin to find references to them in the mid 1700s. Today, when we open an EA lodge we are reminded that we all come "From a Lodge of the Saints John of Jerusalem." We are told in the lecture that a certain point within a circle is embordered by two perpendicular parallel lines representing St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelists, who were perfect parallels in Christianity as well as Masonry."

The importance and influence of St. John the Evangelist is too exhaustive to document here but let us note some of key points. St. John was the youngest disciple, brother of James, and typically depicted without a beard, leaning on Jesus during the last supper "Now there was leaning on Jesus' bosom one

of his disciples whom Jesus loved." (John 13:23). He became the "beloved disciple" and the only one of the Twelve who did not forsake the Savior in the hour of His Passion. St. John authored five books in the KJV bible including Revelation, three epistles (1, 2, and 3 John) as well as the Gospel of John. His Gospel covered a different time span than the others and focused primarily on theological matters. He states that "these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name" (John 20:30). He lived to an extreme old age, surviving all his fellow apostles, and died of natural causes in Ephesus about the year 100.

In the early days of Masonry in Europe, the 27th of December was celebrated within all branches of our fraternity as a great Masonic Festival Day. Unfortunately, over the years, the practice of celebrating our Patron Saints has lost favor within our organization – perhaps our Companions can take this message back to their home Lodges in hopes of restoring a once great celebration.
